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RESOLUTION 2024-12

THE ANNUAL APPROPRIATION RESOLUTION OF THE COLBERT LANDINGS COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT ("DISTRICT") RELATING TO THE ANNUAL APPROPRIATIONS AND ADOPTING THE BUDGET FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING OCTOBER 1, 2024, AND ENDING SEPTEMBER 30, 2025; AUTHORIZING BUDGET AMENDMENTS; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the District Manager has, prior to the fifteenth (15th) day in June 2024, submitted to the Board of Supervisors ("Board") of the Colbert Landings Community Development District ("District") proposed budget ("Proposed Budget") for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2024 and ending September 30, 2025 ("Fiscal Year 2025") along with an explanatory and complete financial plan for each fund of the District, pursuant to the provisions of Section 190.008(2)(a), Florida Statutes; and

WHEREAS, at least sixty (60) days prior to the adoption of the Proposed Budget, the District filed a copy of the Proposed Budget with the local governing authorities having jurisdiction over the area included in the District pursuant to the provisions of Section 190.008(2)(b), Florida Statutes; and

WHEREAS, the Board set a public hearing thereon and caused notice of such public hearing to be given by publication pursuant to Section 190.008(2)(a), *Florida Statutes*; and

WHEREAS, the District Manager posted the Proposed Budget on the District's website at least two days before the public hearing; and

WHEREAS, Section 190.008(2)(a), Florida Statutes, requires that, prior to October 1st of each year, the Board, by passage of the Annual Appropriation Resolution, shall adopt a budget for the ensuing fiscal year and appropriate such sums of money as the Board deems necessary to defray all expenditures of the District during the ensuing fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, the District Manager has prepared a Proposed Budget, whereby the budget shall project the cash receipts and disbursements anticipated during a given time period, including reserves for contingencies for emergency or other unanticipated expenditures during the fiscal year.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COLBERT LANDINGS COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT:

SECTION 1. BUDGET

a. The Board has reviewed the Proposed Budget, a copy of which is on file with the office of the District Manager and at the District's Local Records Office, and hereby approves certain amendments thereto, as shown in Section 2 below.

- b. The Proposed Budget, attached hereto as **Exhibit A**, as amended by the Board, is hereby adopted in accordance with the provisions of Section 190.008(2)(a), *Florida Statutes* ("**Adopted Budget**"), and incorporated herein by reference; provided, however, that the comparative figures contained in the Adopted Budget may be subsequently revised as deemed necessary by the District Manager to reflect actual revenues and expenditures.
- c. The Adopted Budget, as amended, shall be maintained in the office of the District Manager and at the District's Local Records Office and identified as "The Budget for the Colbert Landings Community Development District for the Fiscal Year Ending September 30, 2025."
- d. The Adopted Budget shall be posted by the District Manager on the District's official website within thirty (30) days after adoption, and shall remain on the website for at least 2 years.

SECTION 2. APPROPRIATIONS

There is hereby appropriated out of the revenues of the District, for Fiscal Year 2025, the sum of \$913,078 to be raised by the levy of assessments and/or otherwise, which sum is deemed by the Board to be necessary to defray all expenditures of the District during said budget year, to be divided and appropriated in the following fashion:

DEBT SERVICE FUND – SERIES 2023-1 AND SERIES 2023-2	\$295,658
TOTAL ALL FUNDS	\$983,078

SECTION 3. BUDGET AMENDMENTS

Pursuant to Section 189.016, *Florida Statutes*, the District at any time within Fiscal Year 2025 or within 60 days following the end of the Fiscal Year 2025 may amend its Adopted Budget for that fiscal year as follows:

- a. A line-item appropriation for expenditures within a fund may be decreased or increased by motion of the Board recorded in the minutes, and approving the expenditure, if the total appropriations of the fund do not increase.
- b. The District Manager or Treasurer may approve an expenditure that would increase or decrease a line-item appropriation for expenditures within a fund if the total appropriations of the fund do not increase and if either (i) the aggregate change in the original appropriation item does not exceed the greater of \$15,000 or 15% of the original appropriation, or (ii) such expenditure is authorized by separate disbursement or spending resolution.

c. Any other budget amendments shall be adopted by resolution and consistent with Florida law.

The District Manager or Treasurer must ensure that any amendments to the budget under paragraph c. above are posted on the District's website within 5 days after adoption and remain on the website for at least 2 years.

SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon adoption.

RESOLUTION 2024-13

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COLBERT LANDINGS COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT CONFIRMING A PRIOR DETERMINATION OF BENEFIT AND PROVIDING FOR THE COLLECTION AND ENFORCEMENT OF DEBT SERVICE SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO PENALTIES AND INTEREST THEREON; CERTIFYING AN ASSESSMENT ROLL; PROVIDING FOR AMENDMENTS TO THE ASSESSMENT ROLL; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Colbert Landings Community Development District ("District") is a local unit of special-purpose government established pursuant to Chapter 190, Florida Statutes, for the purpose of providing, operating and maintaining infrastructure improvements, certain infrastructure improvements, facilities and services to the lands within the District; and

WHEREAS, the District is located in Flagler County, Florida ("County"); and

WHEREAS, the District has constructed or acquired various infrastructure improvements and provides certain services in accordance with the District's adopted capital improvement plan and Chapter 190, Florida Statutes; and

WHEREAS, for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2024, and ending September 30, 2025 ("Fiscal Year 2025"), the Board of Supervisors ("Board") of the District has adopted its budget, including its operations and maintenance budget and debt service budget ("Adopted Budget") attached hereto as Exhibit A and now desires to set forth the method by which debt service special assessments shall be collected and enforced; and

WHEREAS, the District has entered into a funding agreement for the purpose of funding its operations and maintenance budget for Fiscal Year 2025 and accordingly is not at this time levying a special assessment to fund its Fiscal Year 2025 operations and maintenance budget; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 197, Florida Statutes, provides a mechanism pursuant to which special assessments may be placed on the tax roll and collected by the local tax collector ("Uniform Method"), and the District has previously authorized the use of the Uniform Method by, among other things, entering into agreements with the Property Appraiser and Tax Collector of the County for that purpose; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of the District to adopt the assessment roll ("Assessment Roll") attached hereto as Exhibit B, and to certify the portion of the Assessment Roll related to certain developed property ("Tax Roll Property") to the County Tax Collector pursuant to the Uniform Method and to directly collect the portion of the Assessment Roll relating to the remaining property ("Direct Collect Property"), all as set forth in Exhibit B; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of the District to permit the District Manager to amend the Assessment Roll adopted herein, including that portion certified to the County Tax Collector by this Resolution, as the Property Appraiser updates the property roll for the County, for such time as authorized by Florida law.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COLBERT LANDINGS COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT:

SECTION 1. BENEFIT & ALLOCATION FINDINGS. The Board finds and determines that the District's capital improvement plan, which is funded in part by the District's debt service special assessments, continues to confer a special and peculiar benefit to the lands within the District, which benefit exceeds or equals the cost of the assessments as set forth in **Exhibits A** and **B**. Additionally, the Board finds and determines that the allocation of the assessments to the specially benefitted lands, as shown in **Exhibits A** and **B**, continues to be fair and reasonable.

SECTION 2. COLLECTION AND ENFORCEMENT; PENALTIES; INTEREST.

- A. **Tax Roll Assessments.** The previously levied debt service special assessments levied on the Tax Roll Property shall be collected at the same time and in the same manner as County taxes in accordance with the Uniform Method, as set forth in **Exhibits A** and **B**.
- B. Direct Bill Assessments. The previously levied debt service special assessments levied on the Direct Collect Property will be collected directly by the District in accordance with Florida law, as set forth in Exhibits A and B. Assessments directly collected by the District are due in full on December 1, 2024; provided, however, that, to the extent permitted by law, the assessments due may be paid in several partial, deferred payments and according to the following schedule: 50% due no later than December 1, 2024, 25% due no later than February 1, 2025 and 25% due no later than May 1, 2025. In the event that an assessment payment is not made in accordance with the schedule stated above, the whole assessment – including any remaining partial, deferred payments for Fiscal Year 2025, shall immediately become due and payable; shall accrue interest, penalties in the amount of one percent (1%) per month, and all costs of collection and enforcement; and shall either be enforced pursuant to a foreclosure action, or, at the District's sole discretion, collected pursuant to the Uniform Method on a future tax bill, which amount may include penalties, interest, and costs of collection and enforcement. Any prejudgment interest on delinquent assessments shall accrue at the rate of any bonds secured by the assessments, or at the statutory prejudgment interest rate, as applicable. In the event an assessment subject to direct collection by the District shall be delinquent, the District Manager and District Counsel, without further authorization by the Board, may initiate foreclosure proceedings pursuant to Chapter 170, Florida Statutes, or other applicable law to collect and enforce the whole assessment, as set forth herein.

C. **Future Collection Methods.** The decision to collect special assessments by any particular method – e.g., on the tax roll or by direct bill – does not mean that such method will be used to collect special assessments in future years, and the District reserves the right in its sole discretion to select collection methods in any given year, regardless of past practices.

SECTION 3. ASSESSMENT ROLL. The Assessment Roll, attached to this Resolution as **Exhibit B**, is hereby certified for collection. That portion of the Assessment Roll which includes the Tax Roll Property is hereby certified to the County Tax Collector and shall be collected by the County Tax Collector in the same manner and time as County taxes. The proceeds therefrom shall be paid to the District.

SECTION 4. ASSESSMENT ROLL AMENDMENT. The District Manager shall keep apprised of all updates made to the County property roll by the Property Appraiser after the date of this Resolution and shall amend the Assessment Roll in accordance with any such updates, for such time as authorized by Florida law, to the County property roll. After any amendment of the Assessment Roll, the District Manager shall file the updates in the District records.

SECTION 5. SEVERABILITY. The invalidity or unenforceability of any one or more provisions of this Resolution shall not affect the validity or enforceability of the remaining portions of this Resolution, or any part thereof.

SECTION 6. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Resolution shall take effect upon the passage and adoption of this Resolution by the Board.

COLBERT LANDINGS COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT FISCAL YEAR 2025 FUNDING AGREEMENT

This agreement ("**Agreement**") is made and entered into this ____ day of August 2024, by and between:

COLBERT LANDINGS COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT, a local unit of special-purpose government established pursuant to Chapter 190, Florida Statutes, and located in City of Palm Coast, Flagler County, Florida ("District"), and

MERITAGE HOMES OF FLORIDA, INC., a Florida corporation and a landowner in the District ("**Developer**") with an address of 13901 Sutton Park Drive., C350, Jacksonville FL 32224.

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the District was established by an ordinance adopted by the City Council of Palm Coast, Florida, for the purpose of planning, financing, constructing, operating and/or maintaining certain infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, the District, pursuant to Chapter 190, Florida Statutes, is authorized to levy such taxes, special assessments, fees and other charges as may be necessary in furtherance of the District's activities and services; and

WHEREAS, Developer presently owns and/or is developing the majority of all real property described in **Exhibit A**, attached hereto and incorporated herein ("**Property**"), within the District, which Property will benefit from the timely construction and acquisition of the District's facilities, activities and services and from the continued operations of the District; and

WHEREAS, the District is adopting its general fund budget for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2024, and ending September 30, 2025 ("Fiscal Year 2025 Budget"); and

WHEREAS, this Fiscal Year 2025 Budget, which both parties recognize may be amended from time to time in the sole discretion of the District, is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference as **Exhibit B**; and

WHEREAS, the District has the option of levying non-ad valorem assessments on all land, including the Property, that will benefit from the activities, operations and services set forth in the Fiscal Year 2025 Budget, or utilizing such other revenue sources as may be available to it; and

WHEREAS, in lieu of levying assessments on the Property, the Developer is willing to provide such funds as are necessary to allow the District to proceed with its operations as described in **Exhibit B**; and

WHEREAS, the Developer agrees that the activities, operations and services provide a special and peculiar benefit equal to or in excess of the costs reflected on **Exhibit B** to the Property; and

WHEREAS, the Developer has agreed to enter into this Agreement in lieu of having the District levy and collect any non-ad valorem assessments as authorized by law against the Property located within the District for the activities, operations and services set forth in **Exhibit B**; and

WHEREAS, Developer and District desire to secure such budget funding through the imposition of a continuing lien against the Property described in **Exhibit A** and otherwise as provided herein.

NOW, THEREFORE, based upon good and valuable consideration and the mutual covenants of the parties, the receipt of which and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. **FUNDING.** The Developer agrees to make available to the District the monies necessary for the operation of the District as called for in the budget attached hereto as **Exhibit B**, as may be amended from time to time in the District's sole discretion, within fifteen (15) days of written request by the District. Amendments to the Fiscal Year 2025 Budget as shown on **Exhibit B** adopted by the District at a duly noticed meeting shall have the effect of amending this Agreement without further action of the parties. Funds provided hereunder shall be placed in the District's general checking account. These payments are made by the Developer in lieu of taxes, fees, or assessments which might otherwise be levied or imposed by the District.
- **CONTINUING LIEN.** District shall have the right to file a continuing lien upon the Property described in Exhibit A for all payments due and owing under the terms of this Agreement and for interest thereon, and for reasonable attorneys' fees, paralegals' fees, expenses and court costs incurred by the District incident to the collection of funds under this Agreement or for enforcement this lien, and all sums advanced and paid by the District for taxes and payment on account of superior interests, liens and encumbrances in order to preserve and protect the District's lien. The lien shall be effective as of the date and time of the recording of a "Notice of Lien for Fiscal Year 2025 Budget" in the public records of Flagler County, Florida ("County"), stating among other things, the description of the real property and the amount due as of the recording of the Notice, and the existence of this Agreement. The District Manager, in its sole discretion, is hereby authorized by the District to file the Notice of Lien for Fiscal Year 2025 Budget on behalf of the District, without the need of further Board action authorizing or directing such filing. At the District Manager's direction, the District may also bring an action at law against the record title holder to the Property to pay the amount due under this Agreement or may foreclose the lien against the Property in any manner authorized by law. The District may partially release any filed lien for portions of the Property subject to a plat if and when the Developer has demonstrated, in the District's sole discretion, such release will not materially impair the ability of the District to enforce the collection of funds hereunder. In the event the Developer sells any of the Property described in Exhibit A after the execution of this Agreement, the Developer's rights and obligations under this Agreement shall remain the same, provided however that the District shall only have the right to file a lien upon the remaining Property owned by the Developer.

3. ALTERNATIVE COLLECTION METHODS.

a. In the alternative or in addition to the collection method set forth in Paragraph 2 above, the District may enforce the collection of funds due under this Agreement by action against the Developer in the appropriate judicial forum in and for the County. The enforcement of the collection of funds in this manner shall be in the sole discretion of the District Manager on behalf of

the District. In the event that either party is required to enforce this Agreement by court proceedings or otherwise, then the parties agree that the prevailing party shall be entitled to recover from the other all costs incurred, including reasonable attorneys' fees and costs for trial, alternative dispute resolution, or appellate proceedings.

- b. The District hereby finds that the activities, operations and services set forth in **Exhibit B** provide a special and peculiar benefit to the Property, which benefit is initially allocated on an equal developable acreage basis. The Developer agrees that the activities, operations and services set forth in **Exhibit B** provide a special and peculiar benefit to the Property equal to or in excess of the costs set forth in **Exhibit B**, on an equal developable acreage basis. Therefore, in the alternative or in addition to the other methods of collection set forth in this Agreement, the District, in its sole discretion, may choose to certify amounts due hereunder as a non-ad valorem assessment on all or any part of the Property for collection, either through the Uniform Method of Collection set forth in Chapter 197, Florida Statutes, or under any method of direct bill and collection authorized by Florida law. Such assessment, if imposed, may be certified on the next available tax roll of the County property appraiser.
- 4. **AGREEMENT; AMENDMENTS.** This instrument shall constitute the final and complete expression of the agreement between the parties relating to the subject matter of this Agreement. Amendments to and waivers of the provisions contained in this Agreement may be made only by an instrument in writing which is executed by both of the parties hereto.
- 5. **AUTHORIZATION.** The execution of this Agreement has been duly authorized by the appropriate body or official of all parties hereto, each party has complied with all the requirements of law, and each party has full power and authority to comply with the terms and provisions of this instrument.
- 6. **ASSIGNMENT.** This Agreement may be assigned, in whole or in part, by either party only upon the written consent of the other, which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld.
- 7. **DEFAULT.** A default by either party under this Agreement shall entitle the other to all remedies available at law or in equity, which shall include, but not be limited to, the right of damages, injunctive relief and specific performance and specifically including the ability of the District to enforce any and all payment obligations under this Agreement in the manner described herein in Paragraphs 2 and 3 above.
- 8. **THIRD PARTY RIGHTS; TRANSFER OF PROPERTY.** This Agreement is solely for the benefit of the formal parties herein and no right or cause of action shall accrue upon or by reason hereof, to or for the benefit of any third party not a formal party hereto. Nothing in this Agreement expressed or implied is intended or shall be construed to confer upon any person or corporation other than the parties hereto any right, remedy or claim under or by reason of this Agreement or any provisions or conditions hereof; and all of the provisions, representations, covenants and conditions herein contained shall inure to the sole benefit of and shall be binding upon the parties hereto and their respective representatives, successors and assigns. In the event the Developer sells or otherwise disposes of its business or of all or substantially all of its assets relating to improvements, work product, or lands within the District, the Developer shall continue to be bound by the terms of this Agreement and additionally shall expressly require that the purchaser agree to be bound by the terms of this Agreement. The Developer shall give 90 days prior written notice to the District under this Agreement of any such sale or disposition.

- 9. **FLORIDA LAW GOVERNS.** This Agreement and the provisions contained herein shall be construed, interpreted and controlled according to the laws of the State of Florida.
- 10. **ARM'S LENGTH TRANSACTION.** This Agreement has been negotiated fully between the parties as an arm's length transaction. The parties participated fully in the preparation of this Agreement with the assistance of their respective counsel. In the case of a dispute concerning the interpretation of any provision of this Agreement, the parties are each deemed to have drafted, chosen and selected the language, and the doubtful language will not be interpreted or construed against any party.
- 11. **EFFECTIVE DATE.** The Agreement shall be effective after execution by both parties hereto. The enforcement provisions of this Agreement shall survive its termination, until all payments due under this Agreement are paid in full.

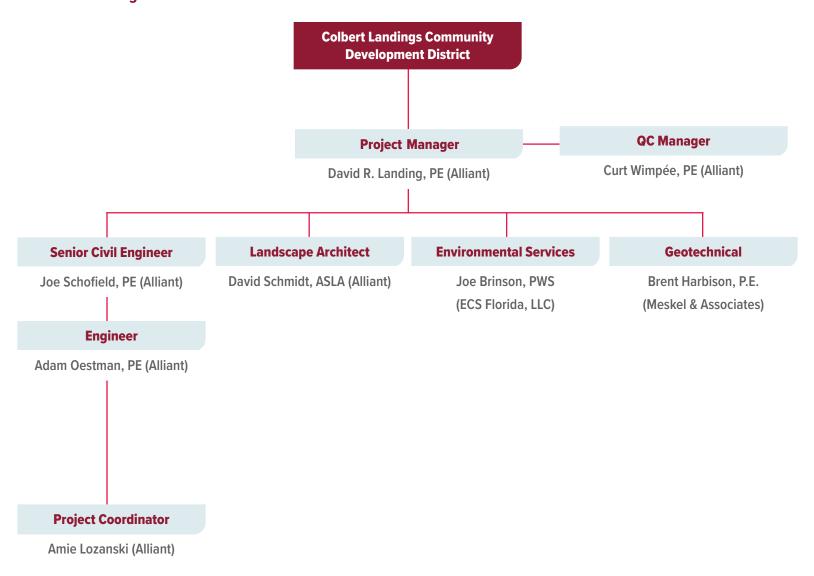

The intent of these meetings is to present "in-progress" plans to the CDD to discuss specific issues where decisions are required that may impact schedule. OSTRs may also include key stakeholders as appropriate. It is envisioned that most OTSR meetings would also be face-to-face.

Progress Meetings

We will use frequent Progress Meetings to keep the CDD's team fully informed and involved in all aspects of the project. These meetings serve as a forum to address issues, hot topics, and identify action items that need to take place. The meetings can also serve as mini "over-the-shoulder" design reviews for portions of the project to get instant feedback from the CDD regarding particular issues. We consider these meeting to provide "collaboration on the fly", and we use them to present all key components of the design prior to the actual submittal. 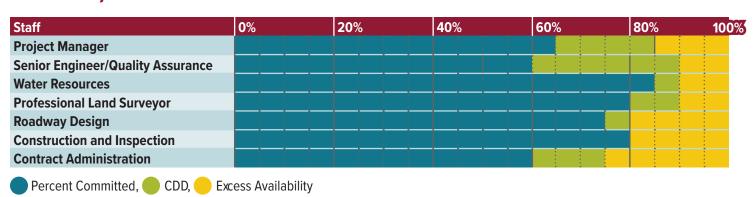

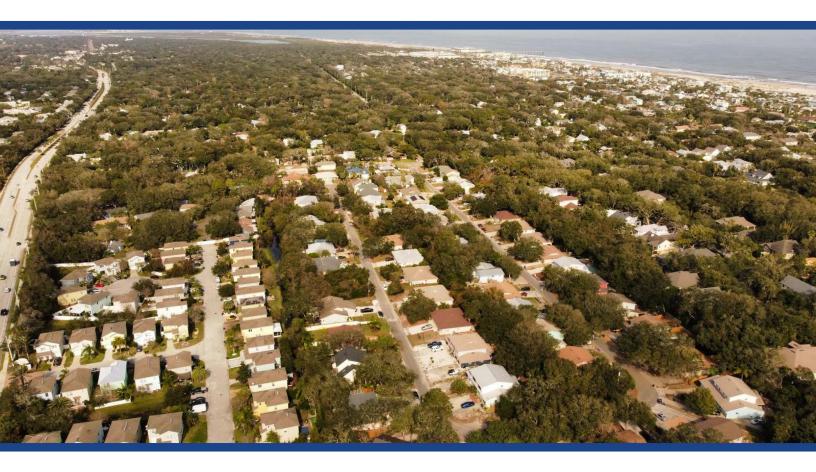
Geographic Location

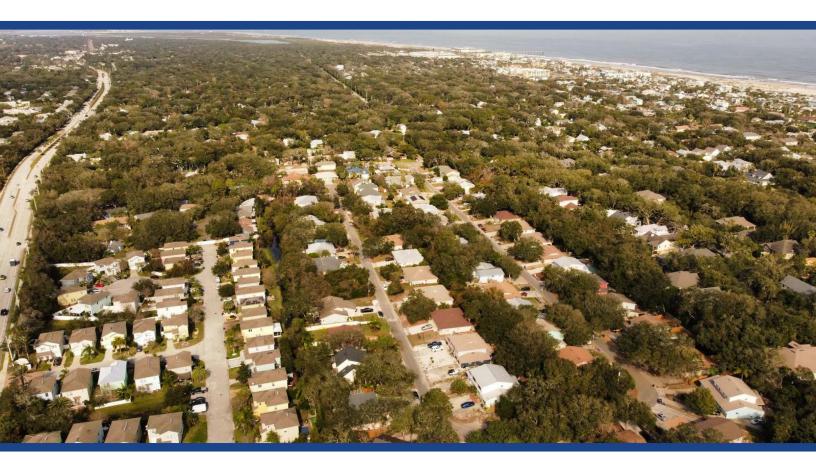
Control of Project Schedule: We understand how critical schedule is to Capital Improvements Projects. Re: Section 189.0694, Florida Statutes (Performance Measures and Standards Reporting)

The purpose of this memorandum is to provide you with additional information regarding new performance measures and standards reporting requirements for special districts. This new requirement was enacted during Florida's 2024 Legislative Session and was originally reported in our legislative newsletters. It has been codified as Section 189.0694, *Florida Statutes*, effective July 1, 2024.

What is required?

The new statute requires special districts (including community development districts) to establish goals and objectives for its programs and activities and performance measures and standards to determine if its goals and objectives have been achieved. The goals, objectives, and performance measures and standards must be established by **October 1, 2024**, or by the end of the first full fiscal year after a District's creation, whichever is later.

The new statute also requires annual reporting each **December 1** (beginning December 1, 2025) on whether the goals and objectives were achieved, which goals or objectives were not achieved, and what measures were used to make the determination.

Are there any mandated goals, objectives, or performance measures/standards?

No. The new statute allows a great deal of flexibility for special districts to adopt the goals, objectives, and performance measures and standards that fit their needs. It is likely that many special districts with similar activities and programs may adopt similar measures, but special districts may also add specialized measures if they wish. Attached is a potential starting point for development of these goals, objectives and performance measures/standards in **Attachment A**. Text of the Bill: 189.0694 Special districts; performance measures and standards.

- (1) Beginning October 1, 2024, or by the end of the first full fiscal year after its creation, whichever is later, each special district must establish goals and objectives for each program and activity undertaken by the district, as well as performance measures and standards to determine if the district's goals and objectives are being achieved.
- (2) By December 1 of each year thereafter, each special district must publish an annual report on the district's website describing:
 - (a) The goals and objectives achieved by the district, as well as the performance measures and standards used by the district to make this determination.
 - (b) Any goals or objectives the district failed to achieve.

FIELD OPERATIONS AGREEMENT

THIS FIELD OPERATIONS AGREEMENT ("Agreement") is made and entered into effective the 10th day of July 2024 by and between:

COLBERT LANDINGS COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT, a local unit of special purpose government established pursuant to Chapter 190, *Florida Statutes*, whose address is c/o Wrathell, Hunt and Associates, LLC, 2300 Glades Road, Suite 410W, Boca Raton, Florida 33431 ("**District**"); and

HOME ENCOUNTER HECM, LLC, a Florida limited liability company, whose mailing address is 12906 Tampa Oaks Blvd., Suite 100, Temple Terrace, FL 33637 ("**Manager**," and together with the District, "**Parties**").

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the District is a local unit of special-purpose government established pursuant Chapter 190, Florida Statutes ("Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the District is authorized to finance, fund, plan, establish, acquire, construct or reconstruct, enlarge and extend, equip, operate, and maintain systems, facilities and infrastructure in conjunction with the development of lands within the District; and

WHEREAS, the District presently owns and is continuing to construct and/or acquire various systems, facilities and public infrastructure ("Improvements") located within the District; and

WHEREAS, the District operates and maintains the Improvements and desires to retain an independent contractor to provide professional field operations management services to oversee maintenance of the Improvements; and

WHEREAS, for ease of administration, potential cost savings to property owners and residents, and the benefits of on-site inspection, operation and maintenance personnel, the District desires to contract with the Manager to manage the operation and maintenance of the Improvements.

- **NOW, THEREFORE,** in consideration of the recitals, agreements, and mutual covenants contained herein, and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged by the Parties, the Parties agree as follows:
- **SECTION 1. RECITALS.** The recitals so stated are true and correct and by this reference are incorporated into and form a material part of this Agreement.

SECTION 2. MANAGER'S OBLIGATION.

A. Specific Duties. Manager shall perform the specific duties described on the

- document attached hereto as **Exhibit A** and incorporated herein by reference which may be amended from time to time pursuant to the terms set forth herein.
- B. General Duties. Manager shall be responsible for the management and oversight of District vendors for the Improvements in an efficient, lawful and satisfactory manner and in accordance with the District's bond covenants relating to such maintenance under the District's direction. Except as provided in Paragraph 8 of Exhibit A attached hereto, Manager shall not have authority to execute contracts and/or change orders on behalf of the District but shall make recommendations for vendors and services to the District. Manager is responsible for the overall supervision of service contractors and maintenance staff, as well as arranging for certain repair and maintenance work. Manager shall report directly to the District Manager and the Board of Supervisors of the District. Manager shall attend monthly board of supervisor meetings when requested by the District Manager or Board of Supervisors.
- C. Inspection. Manager shall conduct two inspections of all District Improvements and property per month and report any irregularities to the District Manager, or his designated representative, and shall correct any irregularities in accordance with the terms of this Agreement. Additional site visits may be subject to additional charges.
- D. Investigation and Report of Accidents/Claims. Manager shall promptly notify the District Manager as to all accidents or claims for damage relating to the management of the District and maintenance and operation of District Improvements. Such report shall at a minimum include a description of any damage or destruction to District Improvements. Manager shall cooperate and make any and all reports required by any insurance company or the District in connection with any accident or claim. Manager shall not file any claims with the District's insurance company without the prior consent of the District Manager or his designee.
- E. Compliance with Government Rules, Regulations, Requirements and Orders. Manager shall take such action as is necessary to comply promptly with any and all orders or requirements affecting District Improvements placed thereon by any governmental authority having jurisdiction. Manager shall immediately notify the District Manager and District Counsel in writing of all such orders or requirements. At the request of the District, Manager shall prepare for execution and filing by the District any forms, reports or returns which may be required by law in connection with the ownership, maintenance and operation of the District Improvements.
- F. Adherence to District Rules, Regulations and Policies. To the extent they apply to Manager's performance herein, Manager's personnel shall be familiar with any and all District policies and procedures and shall ensure that all persons using District Property are informed with respect to the rules, regulations and notices as

may be promulgated by the District from time to time and ensure that said persons conform therewith. Manager may adopt such policies and procedures as it deems necessary to the fulfillment of its obligations under this Agreement provided that copies of such policies and procedures shall be provided to the District. Manager assures the District that all third parties will be dealt with at arm's length, and that the District's interest will be best served at all times.

G. Care of the Property. Manager shall use all due care to protect the property and Improvements of the District, its residents and landowners from damage by Manager, its employees or contractors.

SECTION 3. COMPENSATION. The District shall pay the Manager **Three Thousand, Six Hundred Sixty-Six Dollars and No/100 Cents (\$3,366.00)** per month, as set forth in **Exhibit A** for the provision of field operations management services pursuant to the terms of this Agreement. Payment shall be in accordance with Florida's Local Government Prompt Payment Act, as set forth in Sections 218.70 et seq. of the Florida Statutes. Any increase in price or change in scope of services must be approved in writing, executed by both Parties, prior to implementation of same; any change in price with such executed, written agreement shall be null and void.

SECTION 4. TERM.

- A. The term of this Agreement shall commence as of the date first written above and shall terminate on September 30, 2025, unless otherwise terminated in accordance with this Agreement. Thereafter, this Agreement shall be automatically renewed for additional one (1) year periods unless either party provides at least thirty (30) days' written notice of its intent to not renew the Agreement or otherwise terminates this Agreement pursuant to its terms.
- B. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Manager and the District shall both have the right to terminate this Agreement upon sixty (60) days' written notice without cause. In the event of any termination, the Manager and the District shall use commercially reasonable efforts to cooperate with one another to provide a smooth and orderly transition of responsibilities between the Parties. Any termination of this Agreement shall not release District from its obligation to pay Manager the compensation and reimbursable expenses due for work performed prior to termination, subject to any offsets the District may have for poor performance, damage or other breach of the Agreement.

SECTION 5. INSURANCE. The Manager shall maintain, at its own expense throughout the term of this Agreement, insurance coverage from a reputable insurance carrier, licensed to conduct business in the State of Florida. The Manager shall provide the District a copy of the insurance policy, and any endorsements, prior to the commencement of the services contemplated under this Agreement. District shall also receive thirty (30) days' notice of cancellation of any such insurance policy. Policies shall have the minimum levels of insurance as set forth in this Section 5 or at **Exhibit B**, whichever is greater:

Workers Compensation

Statutory

General Liability (including Independent Contractors Coverage for bodily injury and property damage in connection with any subcontractors' operation, if any.)

Bodily Injury (including contractual)\$1,000,000Property Damage (including contractual)\$1,000,000

General Aggregate \$2,000,000

Automobile Liability (if applicable)

Bodily Injury and Property Damage \$1,000,000

Umbrella Liability \$5,000,000

Insurance obtained by Manager shall be primary and noncontributory with respect to insurance outlined above. All such policies shall be issued by insurance companies licensed to do business in the state of Florida. The District, its Board of Supervisors, officers, staff, employees, representatives, agents and trustees, shall be listed as additional insureds on each such policy, and no policy may be canceled during the term of this Agreement without at least thirty (30) days' written notice to the District. An insurance certificate evidencing compliance with this paragraph shall be sent to the District prior to the commencement of any performance under this Agreement. No policy may be canceled during the term of this Agreement.

SECTION 6. INDEMNITY. Manager agrees to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the District and its officers, supervisors, professional staff, agents, and employees from any and all liability, claims, actions, suits, liens, demands, costs, interest, expenses, damages, penalties, fines, judgments against the District, or loss or damage, whether monetary or otherwise, arising out of, wholly or in part by, or in connection with the services to be performed by Manager, its subcontractors, its employees and agents in connection with this Agreement, including litigation, mediation, arbitration, appellate, or settlement proceedings with respect thereto. Manager shall indemnify the District for any and all percentage of fault attributable to Manager for claims against the District, regardless whether the District is adjudged to be more or less than 50% at fault. Manager further agrees that nothing herein shall constitute or be construed as a waiver of the District's limitations on liability contained in section 768.28, Florida Statutes, or other statute. Obligations under this section shall include the payment of all settlements, judgments, damages, liquidated damages, penalties, forfeitures, back pay awards, court costs, arbitration and/or mediation costs, litigation expenses, attorneys' fees, paralegal fees (incurred in court, out of court, on appeal, or in bankruptcy proceedings), any interest, expenses, damages, penalties, fines, or judgments against the District. The indemnity obligations in this Agreement shall survive expiration or earlier termination of this Agreement.

SECTION 7. RECOVERY OF COSTS AND FEES. In the event either the District or the Manager are required to enforce this Agreement or any provision hereof by court proceedings or otherwise then, if prevailing, the District or the Manager, as applicable, shall be entitled to recover from the other all fees and costs incurred, including but not limited to reasonable attorneys' fees, paralegal fees and expert witness fees and costs incurred prior to or during any litigation or other dispute resolution and including fees incurred in appellate proceedings.

- SECTION 8. LIMITATIONS ON GOVERNMENTAL LIABILITY. Nothing in this Agreement shall be deemed as a waiver of immunity or limits of liability of the District beyond any statutory limited waiver of immunity or limits of liability which may have been adopted by the Florida Legislature in Section 768.28, Florida Statutes, or other statute, and nothing in this Agreement shall inure to the benefit of any third party for the purpose of allowing any claim which would otherwise be barred under the Doctrine of Sovereign Immunity or by operation of law.
- SECTION 9. ASSIGNMENT. Neither party may assign this Agreement without the prior written approval of the other.
- SECTION 10. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR STATUS. In all matters relating to this Agreement, the Manager shall be acting as an independent contractor. Neither the Manager nor employees of the Manager, if there are any, are employees of the District under the meaning or application of any Federal or State Unemployment or Insurance Laws or Old Age Laws or otherwise. The Manager agrees to assume all liabilities or obligations imposed by any one or more of such laws with respect to employees of the Manager, if there are any, in the performance of this Agreement. The Manager shall not have any authority to assume or create any obligation, express or implied, on behalf of the District and the Manager shall have no authority to represent the District as an agent, employee, or in any other capacity, unless otherwise set forth in this Agreement.
- SECTION 11. HEADINGS FOR CONVENIENCE ONLY. The descriptive headings in this Agreement are for convenience only and shall neither control nor affect the meaning or construction of any of the provisions of this Agreement.
- SECTION 12. AGREEMENT. This instrument shall constitute the final and complete expression of this Agreement between the District and the Manager relating to the subject matter of this Agreement.
- **SECTION 13. AMENDMENTS.** Amendments to and waivers of the provisions contained in this Agreement may be made only by an instrument in writing which is executed by both the District and the Manager.
- **SECTION 14. AUTHORIZATION.** The execution of this Agreement has been duly authorized by the appropriate body or official of the District and the Manager, both the District and the Manager have complied with all the requirements of law in order to effectuate the terms of this Agreement, and both the District and the Manager have full power and authority to comply with the terms and provisions of this instrument.
- SECTION 15. NOTICES. All notices, requests, consents and other communications under this Agreement ("Notices") shall be in writing and shall be delivered, mailed by First Class Mail, postage prepaid, or overnight delivery service, to the Parties, as follows:

Except as otherwise provided in this Agreement, any Notice shall be deemed received only upon actual delivery at the address set forth above. Notices delivered after 5:00 p.m. (at the place of delivery) or on a non-business day, shall be deemed received on the next business day. If any time for giving Notice contained in this Agreement would otherwise expire on a non-business day, the Notice period shall be extended to the next succeeding business day. Saturdays, Sundays, and legal holidays recognized by the United States government shall not be regarded as business days. Counsel for the District and counsel for the Manager may deliver Notice on behalf of the District and the Manager. Any party or other person to whom Notices are to be sent or copied may notify the other parties and addressees of any change in name or address to which Notices shall be sent by providing the same on five (5) days' written notice to the parties and addressees set forth herein.

SECTION 16. THIRD-PARTY BENEFICIARIES. This Agreement is solely for the benefit of the District and the Manager, and no right or cause of action shall accrue upon or by reason, to or for the benefit of any third party not a formal party to this Agreement. Nothing in this Agreement expressed or implied is intended or shall be construed to confer upon any person or corporation other than the District and the Manager any right, remedy, or claim under or by reason of this Agreement or any of the provisions or conditions of this Agreement; and all of the provisions, representations, covenants, and conditions contained in this Agreement shall inure to the sole benefit of and shall be binding upon the District and the Manager and their respective representatives, successors, and assigns.

SECTION 17. CONTROLLING LAW; VENUE. This Agreement and the provisions contained in this Agreement shall be construed, interpreted, and controlled according to the laws of the State of Florida. Venue shall be in Flagler County, Florida.

SECTION 18. PUBLIC RECORDS. Manager understands and agrees that all documents of any kind provided to the District in connection with this Agreement may be public records, and, accordingly, Manager agrees to comply with all applicable provisions of Florida law in handling such records, including but not limited to Section 119.0701, Florida Statutes. Manager acknowledges that the designated public records custodian for the District is Wrathell, Hunt and Associates, LLC ("Public Records Custodian"). Among other requirements and to the extent applicable by law, the Manager shall: 1) keep and maintain public records required by the District to perform the service; 2) upon request by the Public Records Custodian, provide the District with the requested public records or allow the records to be inspected or copied within a reasonable time period at a cost that does not exceed the cost provided in Chapter 119, Florida Statutes; 3) ensure that public records which are exempt or confidential, and exempt from public records disclosure requirements, are not disclosed except as authorized by law for the duration of

the contract term and following the contract term if the Manager does not transfer the records to the Public Records Custodian of the District; and 4) upon completion of the contract, transfer to the District, at no cost, all public records in the Manager's possession or, alternatively, keep, maintain and meet all applicable requirements for retaining public records pursuant to Florida laws. When such public records are transferred by the Manager, the Manager shall destroy any duplicate public records that are exempt or confidential and exempt from public records disclosure requirements. All records stored electronically must be provided to the District in a format that is compatible with Microsoft Word or Adobe PDF formats.

IF THE MANAGER HAS QUESTIONS REGARDING THE APPLICATION OF CHAPTER 119, FLORIDA STATUTES, TO THE MANAGER'S DUTY TO PROVIDE PUBLIC RECORDS RELATING TO THIS CONTRACT, CONTACT THE CUSTODIAN OF PUBLIC RECORDS AT (877) 276-0889, GILLYARDD@WHHASSOCIATES.COM, OR 2300 GLADES ROAD, SUITE 410W, BOCA RATON, FLORIDA 33431.

SECTION 19. SEVERABILITY. The invalidity or unenforceability of any one or more provisions of this Agreement shall not affect the validity or enforceability of the remaining portions of this Agreement, or any part of this Agreement not held to be invalid or unenforceable.

SECTION 20. ARM'S LENGTH TRANSACTION. This Agreement has been negotiated fully between the District and the Manager as an arm's length transaction. The District and the Manager participated fully in the preparation of this Agreement with the assistance of their respective counsel. In the case of a dispute concerning the interpretation of any provision of this Agreement, the Parties are each deemed to have drafted, chosen, and selected the language, and any doubtful language will not be interpreted or construed against any party.

SECTION 21. COUNTERPARTS. This Agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts, each of which when executed and delivered shall be an original; however, all such counterparts together shall constitute, but one and the same instrument. Additionally, the Parties acknowledge and agree that the Agreement may be executed by electronic signature, which shall be considered as an original signature for all purposes and shall have the same force and effect as an original signature. Without limitation, "electronic signature" shall include faxed versions of an original signature, electronically scanned and transmitted versions (e.g. via PDF) of an original signature, or signatures created in a digital format.

SECTION 22. E-VERIFY. The Manager shall comply with and perform all applicable provisions of Section 448.095, *Florida Statutes*. Accordingly, to the extent required by Florida Statute, Manager shall register with and use the United States Department of Homeland Security's E-Verify system to verify the work authorization status of all newly hired employees. The District may terminate this Agreement immediately for cause if there is a good faith belief that the Manager has knowingly violated Section 448.091, *Florida Statutes*. By entering into this

Agreement, the Manager represents that no public employer has terminated a contract with the Manager under Section 448.095(2)(c), *Florida Statutes*, within the year immediately preceding the date of this Agreement.

Managerial Services – \$3,366.00 per month

- 1. Operate the improvements and property of the District, including the Improvements, according to the approved budget of the District and consistent with the direction of the Board of Supervisors, subject to proper funding being provided to the Agent to operate in accordance with the budget and governing documents, and according to industry best practices and professional standards.
- 2. Engage and supervise all persons and/or entities, as needed (which persons or entities may be engaged on a part-time or full-time basis), necessary to properly maintain and operate the Improvements and property in accordance with the District's policies, industry best practices and professional standards and Rules of Procedure.
- 3. Solicit and negotiate bids for purchases of services and materials to the District at the direction of the Board.
- 4. Review District vendor invoices, code invoices according to District Adopted Budget, and review and approve payables aging prepared by District Management prior to each check run.
- 5. Solicit, analyze and negotiate recurring contracts on behalf of the District, as needed, for recurring services reasonably necessary with respect to the operation, maintenance, upkeep, repair, replacement, and preservation of the Property.
- 6. Prepare, annually in respect of the next succeeding fiscal year, a proposed operating Budget for the District's field management services. The Budget shall be submitted to the District Manager and Board for comments/changes, and only becomes binding after approval by the Board. The Budget shall serve as a supporting document for the schedule of Assessments.
- 7. Perform routine inspections and make recommendations to the Board as to the maintenance of and Improvements as well as assist the District in the enforcement of the provisions Chapter 190 and rules/regulations relating to the Improvements, including bond covenants and best practices in field management and maintenance services.
- 8. Make or cause to be made, such repair work or normal maintenance to common elements as may be required for the operation and physical protection of the common elements not to exceed Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) for any one item. WHEREAS, the Colbert Landings Community Development District (the "**District**") is a local unit of special-purpose government created and existing pursuant to Chapter 190, Florida Statutes;

WHEREAS, Section 190.011(5), Florida Statutes, authorizes the District to adopt resolutions which may be necessary for the conduct of District business;

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of the District (the "**Board**") typically meets on an as needed basis, and in no event more than monthly, to conduct the business of the District, including approval of proposals, authorizing the entering into of agreements or contracts, and authorizing the payment of District operating and maintenance expenses;

WHEREAS, the Board contracted with the District Manager to timely pay the District's vendors and perform other management functions;

WHEREAS, the Board desires to confirm that the District Manager is authorized to pay invoices, regardless of the dollar amounts, for work previously approved by the Board and such payments do not need to be approved by the Board prior to payment;

WHEREAS, the Board recognizes that certain time sensitive or emergency issues may arise from time to time that require approval outside of regular monthly meetings;

WHEREAS, to conduct the business of the District in an efficient manner, recurring, non-recurring and other disbursements for goods and services must be processed and paid in a timely manner; and

WHEREAS, the Board has determined that it is in the best interests of the District, and is necessary for the efficient administration of District operations; the health, safety, and welfare of the residents within the District; and the preservation of District assets or facilities, to authorize limited spending authority to the Chair (or Vice-Chair if the Chair is unavailable) of the Board, the District Manager, and the onsite management team so designated by the District Manager ("Onsite Management Team") between regular monthly meetings, for work and services that are time sensitive and/or emergency in nature.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD:

- 1. <u>Authorization to Pay Invoices for Work Previously Approved</u>. The District Manager is authorized to pay invoices, regardless of the dollar amounts, for work previously approved by the Board in accordance with such contracts and such payments do not need to be approved by the Board prior to payment nor do they need to be re-approved by the Board at a future meeting.
- 2. <u>Limited Spending Authorization</u>. The Board hereby authorizes the individuals stated below to exercise their judgment to enter into time sensitive and emergency contracts and disburse funds up to the amounts stated below, without prior Board approval for expenses (1) that are required to provide for the health, safety, and welfare of the residents within the District (2) for the maintenance, repair, or replacement of a District asset, or (3) to remedy an unforeseen disruption in services relating to the District's facilities or assets, and such disruption would result in significantly higher expenses unless the contract is entered into immediately.
 - a. The District Manager and Chair (or Vice-Chair if the Chair is unavailable) may jointly authorize such expenses up to \$15,000 per proposal/event.
 - b. The Onsite Management Team may individually authorize such expenses up to \$2,500 per proposal/event.
- **3.** Ratification of Spending Authorization at Future Meeting. Any payment made or contract entered into pursuant to this Resolution shall be submitted to the Board at the next scheduled meeting for approval and ratification.
- **4.** Repeal of Prior Spending Authorizations. All prior spending authorizations approved by resolution or motion of the Board are hereby repealed.
- 5. <u>Effective Date</u>. This Resolution shall become effective immediately upon its adoption.
